Acer platanoides



height: up to 25 m
age: up to 150 years
bark colour: grey
bark structure: fine ridges
leaf shape: palmate
leaf margin: pointed teeth

Typical residents

A number of caterpillars feed on the leaves, and the flowers provide nectar and pollen for bees and other insects. Birds and small mammals eat the seeds.

Special facts

The Norway maple is the common tree in Toronto and Canada. Like other maples, Norway maple can be tapped for its syrup.
